



The LYFA collection is founded on pure aesthetics and a purposeful design philosophy shaped by decades of dedicated craftsmanship and captivating lighting designs. Our collection bridges iconic classics and contemporary designs - crafted to impeccable quality standards and offers light arrangements for every home, occasion and situation.







MEMOIR is a product family designed by GamFratesi based on a modern take and interpretation of the classic chandelier. At the heart of the design is the gently shaped opal glass shade that evokes a historical typology and romantic spirit. The linear metal structures compose a graphic outline that allows it to be connected in numerous compositions. The simplistic ingenuity of the MEMOIR lighting system bridges decorative details of the past and a sculptural silhouette intended for modern spaces.

REPOSE is a series of opal glass lamps designed by GamFratesi. Its strong sense of character is achieved by the poetic balance point of the thin line crossing the top of the organic shades. Designed to provide a calm atmosphere with its diffused light, graphic expression and soft shapes.




#### ERGO TABLE 250 by Bent Karlby <sup>1971</sup>





True to its 1970s space-age heritage, the first ERGO lamps came in popping colours and were made entirely from plastic. While retaining its characteristic design language, ERGO has grown into a premium piece of lighting design.





The name was a reference by Karlby to the gothic architectural style that flourished throughout Europe from the 12th to the 16th century, which was characterized by tall narrow structures with pointed arches. The open top allows for upward lighting that leaves a striking pattern on the wall.

#### PAN PENDANT 190 by Bent Karlby <sup>1970</sup>





The PAN series is a beautiful example of Bent Karlby's unique talent for capturing the zeitgeist of an area and turning it into designs that would come to transcend their inspiration. The monochrome surfaces of anodized aluminium transform the PAN series into contemporary design pieces for modern living.







VERONA PENDANT 720, 600, 480, 400, 320, 250 and 175 by Sven Middelboe <sup>1968</sup>







VERONA is a sophisticated 7-shade pendant that provides soft, glare-free lighting with timeless grace and simplicity. When lit, the spherical pendant beautifully self-illuminates, making for a striking display in itself. VERONA was designed by Sven Middelboe in 1968.




VERONA PENDANT 720 by Sven Middelboe 1968








CORNEA was designed by the renowned sculptor Henning Koppel in 1965 and is one of his rare lighting designs. The circular wall light is shaped with an inner, opal glass shade that provides a comfortable, diffused light. Its distinctive character is achieved by the asymmetric outer shade that encapsulates the soft, white light as two eyelids. The CORNEA lighting design is named as a reference to the transparent part of the human eye, which allows light to enter the inside and enhances sharpness.





### DIVAN 2 PENDANT 245\*





In 1962, Simon P. Henningsen unveiled a new pendant purposely designed for the Tivoli's famous restaurant, Divan 2. The rooms offered spectacular views over the garden lake and at night, the pendant's mirrored surfaces would catch the light from the famous fireworks and the lake.













#### MOSAIK PENDANT 250 SIDE BY SIDE II by Bent Karlby <sup>1959</sup>






The MOSAIK collection is an ingenious lighting system based on a simple, geometrical design principle. At the heart of the system is the iconic conical lampshade and a connecting brass tube that allow for several surprising lamp designs.







GOVERNOR is a sophisticated mid-century lamp from 1956 that proved to carry an enduring appeal with design lovers around the world. This lamp radiates a certain international flair. It is confident and a premium piece of lighting design that still has the power to impress












When giving shape to the NINOTCHKA pendant, Bent Karlby took note of an eye-catching hat, worn by the Swedish Hollywood star Greta Garbo in her 1939 film, Ninotchka. The organic body with its asymmetrical drapes ensures functional direct downlight and an ambient uplight.











SUNDOWNER is designed by Jørn Utzon in 1948. The soft curves and opposite-facing shades are designed prior to Utzon's architectural masterpiece, the Sydney Opera House. With its dynamic design, the SUNDOWNER pendant expresses a clear linkage to the unique shell structures that adorn the Sydney Harbour.









Introduced in 1946 at a time when fluorescent lighting was gaining widespread popularity across society. Bent Karlby shared a strong distaste for this harsh and cold lighting. With its organic shapes and elegant brass detailing, the PEANUT pendant became his solution for soft and pleasant room lighting that was equally appealing to look at.
